

There are approximately 1 billion migrants worldwide, of which 258 million are international migrants and 763 million are internal migrants. More than 80 million are forcibly displaced and 26 million are registered refugees. At least 40 million people are known to be trafficked, and over 4 million have become stateless people, meaning they do not have a nationality of any country.*

Migration flows are part of the world as we know it today. The United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) is working to alleviate the suffering of refugees and migrants all over the world.

How we choose to work with refugees and migrants will be a key challenge in the years ahead. Will we adhere to our biblical mandate to truly welcome the stranger? Might the church be transformed into something greater? Will the church be bold enough to proclaim that there is room for all in the Inn?
